Pasco Abraham, 55, passed away July 12, in Kalispell, Mont.

Mass of Christian burial was held Monday, July 15, at St. Ann's Catholic Church, burial followed at St. Michael's Mission Cemetery.

He was a good storyteller; he always had plenty of stories to share.

His brothers, Abraham Abraham, Tamia Abraham and Lee Abraham, preceded him in death.
