## Funeral Services Conducted Monday For Earl Corner

Earl C. Corner, 71-year-old Moyle Springs resident, passed away suddenly at his home last Thursday, Dec. 9th.

He was born April 22, 1894, at Dumont, Iowa, the son of Oliver and Melinda Reed Corner. He grew up and received his education in Dumont and served in the U. S. Navy during World War I. Following his honorable discharge he married Gladys Coon on Sept. 8, 1919, at Linton, N. Dak. He then started employment with the Northern Pacific railroad and advanced to roundhouse foreman, retiring from the railroad in 1958. He moved to Moyle Springs in 1961 and resided there until his death. He was a member of American Legion Boundary Post No. 55, Bonners Ferry Post No. 3622, Veterans of Foreign Wars, and was serving as commander of World War I Barracks No. 1912 at the time of his death.

Survivors in addition to his widow include two daughters, Mrs. Lola Mortenson, Hayward, Calif., and Mrs. Betty Phillo, Renton, Wash.; two sisters, Mrs. Hazel Shire, Chico, Calif., and Mrs. Lola Talbot, Breenbalk, Wash.; also 10 grandchildren and seven great grandchildren.

Funeral services were conducted last Monday at Hillcrest Memorial Chapel with Rev. Wesley Arms officiating. Interment was in Grandview cemetery, with military graveside rites by Legion Post 55. Pallbearers, all members of World War I Barracks No. 1912, were William S. Reed, Leon VanEtten, Dale Cooper, H. E. Spaulding, Harry Parks and A. L. Lawson.
