Alex E. Fetterley, Longtime Resident, Passes in Washington

Alex E. Fetterley, 74, longtime resident of Bonners Ferry, passed away late Friday evening, Aug. 9, in a Washington hospital following a lingering illness. He was hospitalized since March of this year.

He was born March 31, 1889 at Woodsville, Mich. He moved to Havre, Mont. at a very young age, where he did ranch work. In 1903 he moved to Bonners Ferry, where he farmed and did woods work. He entered the U. S. Army in October of 1917 serving until Dec. 28, 1918 when he received his honorable discharge. He again returned to Bonners Ferry and on August 12, 1921, he married Charlotte May Sweet here.

He was a member of the American Legion, Boundary Post No. 53. Survivors include a stepson, Stanley Sweet; two stepdaughters, Mrs. Thelma Clark of Moyle Springs, and Mrs. Ruby Hartz of Portland, several brothers and sisters in Michigan and several step grandchildren and great grandchildren.

Services were conducted Tuesday, Aug. 13 at the Hillcrest Memorial chapel at 11:00 a.m. with the Rev. W. B. Nelson officiating. Mrs. Arthur Campbell played the organ.

Military graveside rites were conducted by American Legion Boundary Post No. 53. Pallbearers were Alvin Monger, W. W. Deist, Lloyd Nowland, Ralph Fleming, William D. MacLacklan, and J. B. Thompson, members of the Post. Interment followed in Grandview cemetery.
