Wayne Goding passed away Sunday, Nov. 24, 2002 at the Boundary Community Hospital Extended Care Facility.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday, Nov. 27, 2002 at 1 p.m. at the Bonners Ferry Funeral Home Chapel.

He was born Sept. 18, 1905 in Spearfish, S.D. and raised in Custer, S.D. where he met and married the love of his life, Lola Dewitt on April 30, 1931. They were married for 65 years.
