Terry Michael Haynes, 35, passed away April 22, 2002 in Spokane, Wash. he was born on March 6, 1967 in Bonners Ferry, Id. to Donald & Dorothy (Foust) Haynes. He was raised in Paradise Valley until the age of 14.

In November, 1981, Terry moved to Brindisi, Italy with his mother Dorothy, stepfather Jeff Harrell and brother, Randy Haynes. While in Italy, he attended San Vido Air Force Base (DOD) school, while his stepfather served in the U.S. Navy.

Terry was active in cross country, track, traveling to Signella, Sicily, Rome & Naples. He was a member of a five-man team, which traveled to Stuttgart, Germany for the European International where Terry received a varsity letter, a championship medallion & an Adriatic Southern Italian League plaque.

Terry, along with brother Randy, was chosen to work for the Youth Summer Program at the Air Force Base.

After returning to the U.S., Terry graduated from Point Loma High School in San Diego, Calif on June 17, 1986. He was active in the Junior Navy ROTC program for three years and received the Unit Dedication and Rifle awards.

On April 24, 1987, Terry joined the U.S. Navy, serving as a sonar technician. He received a Good Conduct medal, Armed Forces Expeditionary medal and

National Defense Service medal. On February 24, 1993, he was honorable discharged from the service.

Terry then became a long haul truck driver, which he enjoyed immensely, as he loved to travel and meet people. He did this for several years until he met his fiance, Ammie, then he decided to stick closer to home. His current employers were Arrow Construction and United parcel Service in Spokane, where he worked as a local truck driver.

Terry was a people-person with a huge heart, which was evident by the way he enjoyed helping others, not knowing a stranger. He loved his family and his home. He was known as a handyman, was very athletic, enjoyed his workouts at the gym, bicycling and walking.
