She met Don at UCLA during her sorority's party for fledgling weatherman in the service. Five months later an Idaho farm boy, second of seven, and an only child from fashionable L.A. were married in Colorado Springs on Halloween in 1944.

Don and Lynn's lives were inseparable and so intertwined as to not be able to know one without knowing the other. Their great passions in life have always been each other, their children, their faith and the outdoors.

They joined the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Coeur d'Alene in 1951 and became known as stalwarts throughout the Idaho panhandle and Creston, B.C. because of selfless devotion to others, particularly the youth and Scouting.
