Pearl Howerton passes

Pearl C. Howerton died on July 10 in the E.C.F. Wing of the Community Hospital in Bonners Ferry. Funeral services were held on Friday, July 13, at 1 p.m. in the Bonners Ferry Funeral Home Chapel with Rev. William Green officiating.

Interment followed in the Moravia Cemetery. Pearl was born on December 11, 1891 in Shelby County, Mo. to Joseph and Ella Howerton. He attended school in Shelby County and

later worked as a cook and owned a Candy Kitchen there. In the early 1930's he moved to the Bonners Ferry area. On March 12, 1945 Pearl married Mamie Ewing.

Pearl worked as a cook in area forest service camps and for the rail road on the Empire Builder. He went to work for the Ellersick Mill until he retired in the late 1960's.
