MRS. W. J. HUNT DIES IN OREGON

Body Returned to Bonners Ferry—
Funeral Was Tuesday.

The funeral of Zelma Violet Hunt was held at 2 o'clock Tuesday afternoon at the Methodist church, the services being conducted by Rev. R. W. Mason. The services were attended by a large company of the friends of the deceased and her family. Appropriate hymns were sung by a choir of mixed voices and Mrs. R. W. Mason sang a solo. The pallbearers were O. N. Southwick, J. W. Reid, A. P. Zimmerman, C. W. Gunther, George R. Causton and Charles McGlocklin. Interment was had in the Grandview cemetery.

The deceased died at Burns, Ore., on June 13, following an operation she underwent on June 3.

Mrs. Hunt was born March 12, 1897, at Correctionville, Iowa. In 1907 she came with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. P. F. Heitt, to Bonners Ferry, where she lived until 1910, when the family moved to Alberta, living there ten years. She was married to Wilfred J. Hunt at Edmonton, Alberta, on December 13, 1917. In 1923 Mrs. Hunt and her husband returned to Bonners Ferry, accompanying her parents. The Hunt family left here again in May, 1925, for points in Oregon to look for a new home.

The deceased is survived by her husband and two children, her father and mother, a brother and a sister.

Mr. Hunt's parents were here to attend the funeral.

The deceased was held in the highest esteem here and hosts of friends mourn her death and extend their heartfelt sympathies to the bereaved family.
