Nettie Hiebert Amoth Justus Passed away on Dec. 7, 2004 at her home near Bonners Ferry, Idaho after an extended illness. Funeral Services were held on Saturday, Dec. 11, 2004 at 11 a.m. in the Mountain View Mennonite Church with burial following in the Mountain View Mennonite Cemetery.

Nettie Hiebert Amoth Justus was born to David and Stella Dick Hiebert on Dec. 16, 1927 at Langdon, N.D.

She passed away at her home in Bonners Ferry, Idaho with her family by her bedside, reaching nearly 77 years of age.
