Post Falls, Idaho where she was able to continue with her love for music. she traveled with the "Hilliard Belles", putting on shows for Senior Centers and Nursing homes throughout the area. She also joined with friends Delores and Ralph Allert of Ritzville, Washington and Bill Austin of Post Falls to form the "Golden Oldies" that entertained at Senior Centers around the area.
