She never forgot the family, food, and memories she left in Mississippi, and made a number of trips back there to enjoy the company of her extended family and the joys of fresh okra and good cornbread.

For many years she served

the First Baptist Church as an organist, and she loved the old hymns, especially "Living for Jesus." Kathleen found joy in the simple pleasures of life: few things were more precious to her than good food shared with good friends and beloved family.

Kathleen goes to join her husband Leo, as well as her mother Willie Vera Hudson, her father James Hudson, her brothers James and Joe, and her sister Fufie.
