## Final Services Held Today For James McIsaac

Funeral services for James McIsaac, 90, who passed away at his apartment in the Estlund building early Tuesday morning following a heart attack, were held from the Morse Funeral Home this morning at 10 o'clock with the Rev. Ralph M. Walsh officiating. Interment was in Grandview cemetery.

The pallbearers were H. E. Blackburn, A. C. Hepworth, C. D. Simonds, Howard Kent and G. G. McBride.

Mrs. A. G. Edmondson sang two solos, "Abide With Me" and "Rock of Ages" with Mrs. Ferne Crowley accompanying at the organ.

The deceased was born on May 12, 1856, in New Brunswick, Canada. He came to the United States in 1866 with his parents and settled in Wisconsin. On June 10, 1882, he was married to Sarah Dolan at Hudson, Wisconsin, and to this union six children were born. In 1924 the family moved to Bonnors Ferry. During his years of residence here he was employed by local lumber companies and by the forest service. About eight years ago, while working for the forest service, an injury confined him to the hospital for many months. His wife passed away here several years ago.

Mr. McIsaac had been a member of Bonnors Ferry Lodge No. 43, A. F. & A. M.

Surviving are three sons, Schiller McIsaac, Seattle, Wash.; and Earl and James, in Alaska, and one daughter, Mrs. C. W. King, of this city. Two other children preceded him in death.
