**Shoop, Charles Wesley**

Died at home on the North Bench Last Thursday Morning

The funeral of Charles Wesley Shoop, who died last Thursday morning at his home on the south bench, after a long illness from diabetes, was held Saturday afternoon at the Methodist church; the services being conducted by Rev R. W. Mason. Interment was had in the Grandview cemetery.

The funeral services were attended by a large company of the friends of the deceased and his family, and there were many beautiful floral tributes. The pallbearers were H. O. Jackson, C. L. Buck, Roy Lusse, Clarence Fisk, Oliver Rabdau and J. L. Leach.

The deceased was born June 1, 1862 in New York City. When a young man he went to Vanderbilt, Mich., where, on February 22, 1905, he was married to Hattie Foster.
