After that, he worked for North American Aviation as a mechanic. As a hobby, he got interested in beekeeping. When North American closed its plant, he opened his own mechanics garage in Clovis. Calif., but it was short-lived as a California highway project went right through the garage.

He decided to expand his hobby into a full-time business which did very well until the smog and increased use of pesticides were killing off too many of the bees.

He began looking for a place to move; that's how he showed up in Naples, Idaho with a truck loaded with 500 hives of bees. For five years he supplied the community with some of the tastiest honey. By the time he sold the bees, he had already started Virden's

CB Sales & Service and he repaired, sold CB radios and other equipment for people in Montana, Idaho Washington and Canada. He like helping people.

So Everett, Ray Clark and Arnold Pherson started H.E.A.R.T.(Highway Emergency Assistance Radio Team). They provided help to people stuck or broke down in water or lost hikers. This was his joy, helping people. And as for retiringm his answer was, "I wouldn't have anything to do. When I wake up and find myself dead, then I'll quit."

Everett was preceded in death by his father, William Henry, in 1929 in Phippsberg, Colo.; his mother, Effie May (Phelps) Virden in 1979 in Sandpoint, Id.; his brother, Floyd, died of the flu in 1925 at the age of 15.

Everett is survived by his wife, Haroldine Virden, at the Extended Care Facility; his son, Ronald William Virden, and wife Thalia of Stockton, Calif.; his two daughters, Gloria Jean Kjos and husband Kevin of Bonners Ferry; Judith Deen Musial and husband Jim of Naples, Idaho; his sister, Laura Cauyhey, of Storm Lake, Iowa.
